Attendance. Mr Strong and Mr Wood (Chair of Governors) write:

'As a school we are concerned about the current levels of absence of some of our children. It is a statutory obligation for children to attend school each day unless they are ill, receiving medical treatment or the absence has been authorised by the Headteacher. Every child has a right to attend school and parents are obliged to ensure this happens. Absence from school seriously disrupts a child's progress. Research show that even if it as little as 10 days in a school year (5% absence) a child's attainment at SATs and later GCSEs is badly affected and in turn their career aspects in early adulthood. Please do think seriously before requesting absence. Children should not be kept away if they are worried by something at school or have fallen out with their peers. It is better for the child to attend school and for any issues to be resolved. We are working with a group of local schools who also share the same concerns as we do and are supported by Dorset County Council and the Government department responsible for education nationally. As part of our work to lower absence rates we already acknowledge with certificates those pupils with good attendance and will always offer family support when needed. We will over the next few weeks be contacting parents where their child's absence rates are above 10%, wishing to discuss the matter with them. Please support our drive to reduce absence rates so that every child is given the chance to have a full education'.
