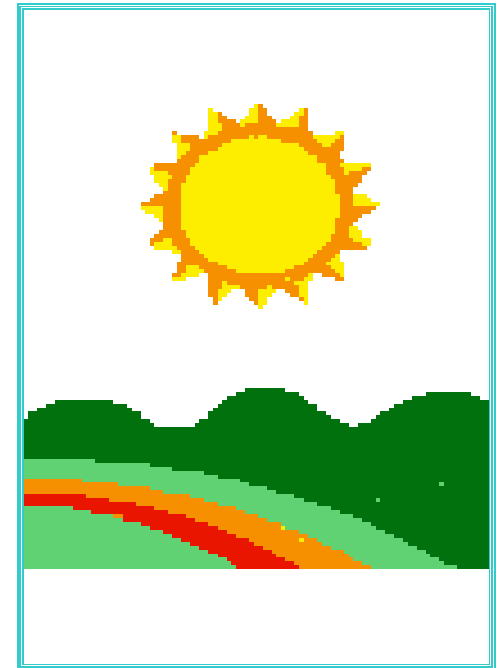

**Comprehensive review of Reading:
To ensure that all pupils make greater progress.**

Implementation of Community Cohesion Strategy:

Implementation of Electronic Assessment System, School Pupil Tracker Online:

To further develop consistent practice throughout school so that children and their parents know how well they are doing.

Prepare for the introduction of a new Primary Curriculum:

As advised by the Coalition Government’s Department for Education.

Continue to strengthen Governors involvement in the Buddy System:
Governors team up with Teachers to challenge and support Curriculum areas.

Develop the junior playground and infant gardens.

Continue with the National 1:1 Tuition Scheme:

This is aimed at pupils in Years 4, 5 and 6 falling behind with their work in reading, writing and mathematics. For each child involved, it runs for 1 hour a week over 10 weeks.
